Event summary

Unrest in New Caledonia

On 14 May, clashes between police and rioters broke out amid separate rallies in Nouméa over the French National Assembly's vote on a constitutional amendment to allow French citizens who have been residing in New Caledonia for at least ten uninterrupted years to cast their votes at local elections in the territory. This change would boost support for anti-independence parties and shift the balance of power in local institutions.

At least five people were killed in and around Nouméa and one person was killed in Kaala-Gomen, North province, amid riots. Hundreds of people were injured, including around 100 police officers and gendarmes, and 230 people were arrested in and around Nouméa since 14 May.

French President Emmanuel Macron declared a territory-wide state of emergency banning public gatherings through 27 May. A daily 18:00-06:00 local time curfew was also imposed across New Caledonia until 06:00 local time on 27 May.
